- If To remain a qualified voter, you must notify your local voter
- You registration office of any change in your name or address.

#### ABSENTEE VOTING

Any registered voter may request an absentee ballot.

**By Mail or Fax**: Absentee ballot application forms are available at the voter registration office or can be downloaded from the voter registration website. A voter can request ballots for future elections by mail in lieu of submitting an application for each election. Completed mailed applications must be received by the registrar not less than 10 days before an election. Voted ballots returned via USPS must be postmarked by election day and received by the registrar by the 3<sup>rd</sup> business day after the election. **In Person**: Registered voters may vote during early voting at the Registrar's office beginning 45 days before an election. In-person voting ends at 5pm on the Saturday before each election.
