POLLS ARE OPEN FROM 6 A.M. TO 7 P.M. FOR ALL ELECTIONS

Check your voter registration card or letter for your correct voting site.

All voters are required to present identification at the polls.

Contact your General Registrar for appropriate forms of identification,

or visit the VA Department of Elections website.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A citizen of the United States
- A resident of Virginia
- At least 16 years of age. You must be 18 by this November 7th, 2023 to be eligible to vote in the 2023 General Election

VOTER REGISTRATION

Where You may apply online or at the following sites: County Registrar Office, Public Library; Department of Motor Vehicles Offices; Public Assistance Agency offices, i.e., those offering food stamps, aid to dependent children and/or aid to persons with disabilities, etc.; Military Recruitment Offices, or District Governmental Centers. For other locations and for more information contact your General Registrar.

When You may register year-round except during the 22 days prior to a general or primary election or 13 days prior to a special or district election. Registration will be permanent under most circumstances.

If To remain a qualified voter, you must notify your local voter

You registration office of any change in your name or address.

Move For information, contact your General Registrar.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Any registered voter may request an absentee ballot. **After June 30th 2023**, witness signature is no longer required when mailing in an absentee ballot.

By Mail or Fax: Absentee ballot application forms are available at the voter registration office or can be downloaded from the voter registration website. A voter can opt to have future ballots mailed to them in lieu of submitting an application for each election. Complete mailed applications must be received by the General Registrar not less than 10 days before an election. Voted ballots returned via USPS must be postmarked by election day and received by the registrar by noon of the 3rd business day after GE

In Person: Registered voters may vote during early voting at the Registrar's office beginning 45 days before an election. In-person early voting ends at 5pm on the Saturday before each election.

ABOUT THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

The League of Women Voters [LWV] was founded in 1920, just prior to the ratification of the 19th amendment to the U.S. Constitution that gave women the right to vote. Now, as then, its purpose is to provide materials to enable voters to become informed before casting their ballots.

While the LWV acts on selected governmental issues, based on positions reached after study and member agreement, it is strictly nonpartisan – it neither supports nor opposes political parties or candidates for public office.

The LWV encourages political responsibility through informed and active participation in government. It influences public policy through education and advocacy.

The League of Women Voters of the Charlottesville Area is a civic organization financed through the dues and donations of its members and contributions from interested citizens and businesses. Membership is open to men and women who are at least 18 years of age. New members and contributors are always welcome.

- *coordination among agencies and levels of government*
- *adequate financing*
- *effective enforcement*
- *well-defined channels for citizen input and review*
