POLLS ARE OPEN FROM 6 A.M. TO 7 P.M. FOR ALL ELECTIONS

Check your voter registration card or letter for your correct voting site.

All voters are required to identification at the polls.

Contact your General Registrar for appropriate forms of identification, or visit the VA Department of Elections website.

You are eligible to register in order to vote in 2023 elections if you are:

- A citizen of the United States
- A resident of Virginia
- At least 18 years of age or will be by the next general election

VOTER REGISTRATION

Where You may apply online or at the following sites: County Registrar's Office, Public Library; Department of Motor Vehicles Offices; Public Assistance Agency offices, i.e., those offering food stamps, aid to dependent children and/or aid to persons with disabilities, etc.; Military Recruitment Offices, or District Governmental Centers. For other locations and for more information contact your General Registrar.

When You may register year-round except during the 22 days prior to a general or primary election or 13 days prior to a special election. Same day registration is available during early voting within the 22 days prior period and on election day as a provisional ballot. Registration will be permanent under most circumstances.

If To remain a qualified voter, you must notify your local voter registration office of any change in your name or address.

You Move For information, contact your General Registrar.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Any registered voter may request an absentee ballot.

By Mail or Fax: Absentee ballot application forms are available at the voter registration office or can be downloaded from the voter registration website. A voter can request ballots for future elections by mail in lieu of submitting an application for each election. Completed mailed applications must be received by the registrar not less than 10 days before an election. Voted ballots returned via USPS must be postmarked by election day and received by the registrar by noon on the 3rd business day after election.

In Person: Registered voters may vote during early voting at the Registrar's office beginning 45 days before an election. In-person early voting ends at 5pm on the Saturday before each election.
